




Chapter 4

- Created maps of the area and served as guides



 Mountain men came to make a profit trapping beaver for fur pelts. They also created maps of western regions.




Chapter


 James Beckwourth was born a slave in Virginia. He later became a fur trapper who explored widely throughout Utah.
